Minutes of the High Council of Nauvoo Illinois

The High Council of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints of Nauvoo Illinois met in Council at the office of Joseph Smith February the 6th 1841.

The Council appointed Aaron Johnson, in conformity to a revelation previously given to that effect, to the office of High Councillor, in the place of Austin Cowles, to fill the place of Seymour Brunson deceased.

A charge was preferred against [t], John P. Green, by Jacob Wirick, for abuse for lent money, which he lent him and not redeeming it according to promise; and for unchristian-like conduct towards him.

The defendant plead not guilty. Numbers. 1 (Elias Hibgee) 2, (David Dort) 3, ([] Lewis D. Wilson) 4, (Moah Packard pro. tem. for Alpheus Cutler) 5, (David Fulmer) and 6, (Samuel H. Smith pro tem. for John P. Green) were appointed to speak on the case.

The President decided that the defendant should give his note to the plaintiff for the money due him with this understanding, between the parties. That he, the plaintiff should not oppress or cause him, the defendant, to be oppressed, untill he, the defendant, is able, in the Providence of God, to pay the plaintiff the sum due him.

That if he, the plaintiff does oppress or cause to-be-oppressed him, the defendant, to be oppressed contrary to the above decision, he, the plaintiff, shall be guilty of unchristian-like conduct, and subject to be tried, for the same, before the High Council. Which decision was sanctioned by the Council.

The Council adjourned one hour.

The Council met again according to adjournment, when the following charges were preferred by Wm Niswanger and B. L. Clapp Viz: January 26th 1841

We prefer a charge against Elder Theodore Turley.

1. For unchristian conduct while on the sea for romping and kissing the females and dancing.

2. For sleeping with two females coming up the Lakes and on the road to Dixons ferry.

3. For not settling with the brethren for what money he recieved of them, and taking the lumber from the boat without leave.

4. For threatning the brethren that Brother Joseph would not hear any thing that they would not tell him about him for he was of the same spirit and signified the same Priesthood signifying if they told him he would not hear them

The defendant plead not guilty. Numbers 7 (Thomas Grover) 8, (Aaron Johnson) 9, (Newel Knight) 10, (William Huntington) 11, (Charles C. Rich) 12, (Henry G. Sherwood) were appointed to speak on the case.

The charges were sustained. After which the President decided that he, the defendant, in order to retain his fellowship, should acknowledge, both before the Council, and also, to a publick congregation, that he had acted unwisely, unjustly, imprudently, and unbecoming, and that he had set a bad example before his brethren and sisters as he was coming over from Europe.

The Council sanctioned the President's decision. Elder Theodore Turley then made a confession to the satisfaction of the Council, and stated that he would rejoice in the opportunity of making the like confession before the publick.

Adjourned
