This diary covers the excommunication of John W. Woolley, the excommunication of Thomas J. Steed (and his wives, Pamela Barlow & Josie Steed — probably married to him by John W. Woolley), ~~the~~ in detail the fundamentalist group, ~~and~~ the appointment of James E. Talmage to aid state presidents in excommunicating fundamentalists, and the excommunication of Lorin C. Woolley.

- 3) General Conference address by Heber J. Grant on fundamentalists. This talk gives the background info. on Lorin Woolley's excommunication (p. 10), making Lorin Woolley perhaps the only man in over century to be publically vilified — by name — over the General Conference palpably.

I inquired about the wages of undergraduate research assistants in History. BYU pays them \$7.00/hour. If that's too steep, let me know.

I'm keeping a running total of expenditures. Here's what it looks like so far.

\$20 (leftover from before)	\$145.00
+ \$125 (recent check)	<u>\$145.00</u>
- 45.00 (3 x \$15.00 - priesthood lectures)	<u>\$95.00</u>
- 5.00 (Postage on priesthood lectures)	<u>\$90.00</u>
- 12.10 (Enclosed copies + postage)	<u>\$82.90</u>
- (Hourly wage x 4)	<u><u>\$82.90</u></u>

P.S. Thanks a bunch for working out this arrangement with me. It helps!

Whatever my hourly wage is, multiply it by four and subtract that from \$82.90, and that's how much I have left in the fundamentalist fund. (If the wage is \$7/hour, then the total ^{remaining} would be \$54.90.)
